MARYS ROAD. 1<sup>ST</sup> READING.** A motion made by Alderman Prince, second by Alderman Donovan Bill No. 4392 was placed on its first reading, read by title only, considered and passed with a 7-0-1 vote of the Board of Alderman with Alderman Smith absent. A motion was made by Alderman Eydmann, second by Alderwoman Johnson to proceed with the second and final reading of Bill No. 4392. Motion carried 7-0-1 with Alderman Smith absent. A motion was made by Alderman Prince, second by Alderman Eydmann, Bill 4392 was place on its second reading, read by title only, considered and passed by a roll call vote as follows: Ayes: Alderwoman Susan Johnson, Alderman Mike Jokerst, Alderman Bob Donovan, Alderman Jeff Eydmann, Alderman Mike Raney, Alderman Joe Prince, and Alderwoman Ashley Armbruster. Motion carried 7-1-0 with Alderman Smith absent.

## **CITY ADMINISTRATOR REPORT**

October 22, 2020

1. Joint Levee Commission meeting is Monday, October 25, 2021 to work on how to best be able to convey property to the US Fish and Wildlife Service as part of the Urban Levee Project. We have developed a few different resolutions as we have shifted our focus to bring Levee District III more into the mix.
2. We have a bid construction meeting Thursday morning at 10a to go over the work replacing the concrete wall on Washington St. Work will begin by N. B. West Contracting soon after that weather permitting.
3. Bid packets are out to 5 companies interested in helping the city maintain its IT equipment and providing services. Qualifications are due November 13 and then we can start our review.
4. Computers have arrived for the police department and we'll look at installation after construction and the City contracts with an IT firm. Due to our troubles ordering from Dell we missed the end of budget year timeline and will pull payment from the administrative computer approval in the Fiscal Year 2021 budget.
5. We will keep posting on Facebook as we get closer to Halloween that it will go on as scheduled and that we ask all to follow CDC guidelines for those trick or treating and those handing out candy.

**OPERATIONS REPORT – Ste. Genevieve**

**September 2020**

**Water Treatment Plant**

- Staff repaired vinyl fencing located at the water plant.
- Met with a vendor concerning the relining of the HeliCarb tank. After a thorough inspection we found that the lining is failing due to corrosion.
- The contactor for High Service motor # 3 failed. This unit was rebuilt and has been reinstalled. Though we also found the transformer is bad as well. A new one has been ordered.
- The carbon dioxide tank has a leak in a refrigeration line. We contacted a CryoGas for the repairs.
- Chemicals for the water treatment process have been sent out for the purpose of checking on price changes or fluctuations for 2021. Still waiting for final numbers.

**Wastewater Treatment**

- Staff continues to decant from the million-gallon tank in preparation of Bio Solids removal.
- Flow meter for the influent waters has been ordered. This unit will have about a 4-week lead time.
- Staff has also began painting the exposed piping and concrete areas for safety.
- Routine maintenance and inspections were performed as scheduled.

## OPERATIONS REPORT – Ste. Genevieve

### Collection/Distribution

#### Collections

- Found a manhole on Glenda St. that was buried. We ordered a riser for this and brought it to grade.
- MLDS has continued work on Westwood Drive. They were discharging lime residuals to the collection system where it was causing blockages. They have since made modifications to their system and paid to have all affected lines cleaned.
- Located and inspected the sewer main on St Marys Road for the construction of the cabin.
- Cleaned Progress Lift Station and began treating it with a product called Bio Safe, for grease control.
- Repaired the sewer pumping station for the bathroom in the city park.
- All easements were inspected, and the needed work has been completed.
- All lift stations were inspected at a minimum of 3 times per week. Staff inspects for grease build up, vandalism, and any electrical issues that would indicate issues with pumps, motors, or controls.

#### Distribution

- Jerry Klein's water service is no fed from Roberts St instead of LaPorte St. and the meter is now outside
- The booster station on Basler Drive is still awaiting the installation and programming of the VFD. This is scheduled for late October.
- Dewatered the lime ponds to aid in the removal of the lime residuals.
- Staff completed a variety of work on meter pits that needed work.
- Staff worked towards keeping the dust down the streets from the water line project.
- Assisted SGFD on a brush fire with our water truck.

- Staff performed 81 line locates
- Staff performed 63 work orders
- Disconnects for non-payment 25
- There were 4 loads of lime purchased

## **TOURISM REPORT (October 22, 2020)**

### **UPCOMING EVENTS (And Places That Are Open)**

- The Ste. Genevieve Museum Learning Center did a soft opening this past weekend. It is open from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Friday through Sunday. The price of admission currently includes access to the Hall of Giants (dinosaurs) and some other areas. Since the entire building is not yet open, those who buy admission tickets now also will receive a free ticket to return when more of the galleries are open.
- The Ste. Genevieve Art Guild has opened its museum and art center in the former museum building on the Courthouse Square. It is open on 1 to 4 p.m. Fridays and 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturdays.
- Brix Urban Winery and Market is opening on Saturday, October 24.

Also, this weekend, the 24th:

- Saxophonist Gerry Huggins will play at the pergola on Main and Merchant from 1 to 4 p.m. (We will use the Welcome Center if it ends up raining.)
- The annual Pumpkin Glow event is 4 to 8 p.m. with pumpkin carving and pumpkin painting activities in addition to hot chocolate and marshmallows. (Businesses and organizations can place a pumpkin in the park October 21 to October 23. Kind of a small free ad if you have pumpkin-carving skills.)
- The Deja vu Spirit Reunion is 5 to 8 p.m. in Memorial Cemetery. About 25 re-enactors portraying various spirits will tell the stories of those buried in Missouri's oldest organized cemetery. Funds help the Foundation of Restoration's work in the cemetery.
- On October 31, the Halloween Spooktacular is 2 to 5 p.m. downtown.
- On November 7, Pecanapoolaza will include live music by a bluegrass band, Po'Anna at Lions Park; food vendors and crafts such as blacksmithing. There will be a pie contest. There will be pecans for sale. A corn hole tournament and tomahawk throwing will be among the activities. The event is a small-scale pop-up event with Rural Heritage Day not taking place this year, and has a goal toward being the kind of festival that taps into fall and Thanksgiving. With its proximity to Veterans Day, we have involved Chris Kertz to display some of his military vehicles, and French Colonial America is coordinating a military living history timeline. Part of Market Street in front of the Welcome Center and the from Second to Main will be closed to promote a street festival atmosphere. The event will offer the chance to donate canned items on the Cub Scouts food drive or to USO Missouri to provide holiday meals to low income military families.
- November 14 is Cookie(less) Crumb Trail and Yippee-Ki-Yay Cookie Day.

### **DOWNTOWN SIGNS**

The last check for orders on the wayfinding signs was handed to Lawrence Myers on Wednesday, October 14.

As we wound down the program for this round, some other new businesses or businesses seeking to add signs made requests and put in orders. They hadn't known

who to contact in the past, so I'm glad we were able to add more businesses who believe this signage is valuable.

As there are now more than 20 individual sign blades requested, Lawrence put in an order for additional blank signs beyond what the city had on hand.

I will keep you posted as the process continues to have those signs made and then to have city workers place them on the posts.

I believe the form from Downtown Ste. Genevieve listed May and November as change-out dates. I certainly hope to see them updated before the Christmas event, and I will lobby to make installation a priority on the city's end once the signs are back in hand.

### **GRANT PROGRAM**

I am including some data related to the Facebook program that is part of our grant marketing, bringing increased awareness to Ste. Genevieve.

Among the organic traffic (not paid), posts related to the Ste. Genevieve Museum Learning Center have the most reach. Two posts on October 16 reached more than 10,000 people.

### **WELCOME CENTER**

Things have been coming and going from the Welcome Center on a near weekly basis. The additions include:

- The 1830s diorama which had been in the Bauvais-Amoureux House [formerly a Missouri State Parks property donated to the National Park Service. The diorama was commissioned by Les Amis and created by Lewis Pruneau, who worked extensively with Jim Baker in that process. Lewis did the repair work on it after the move by city workers.]
- A vertical log architecture display the Missouri State Parks had in the Bauvais-Amoureux House created by the state agency, again based on Baker's research.
- An exhibit on early Ste. Genevieve on loan from French Colonial America.

What we've seen in just the brief time is that people are spending more time in the Welcome Center and doing more reading of the material.

The National Park Service is planning to place more exhibits along the back/northern wall of the main room; and a park-related associated has scouted the space for a merchandise space.

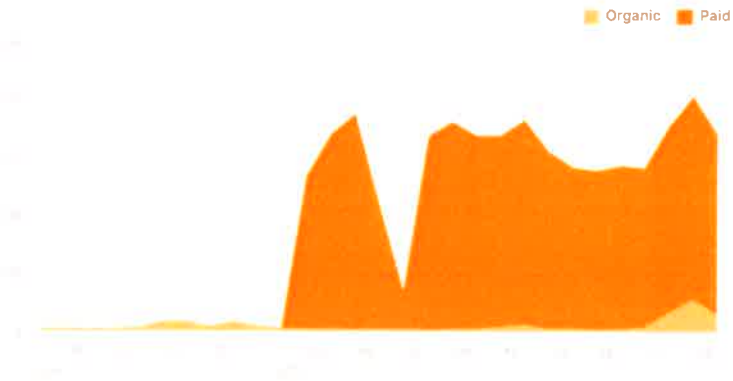

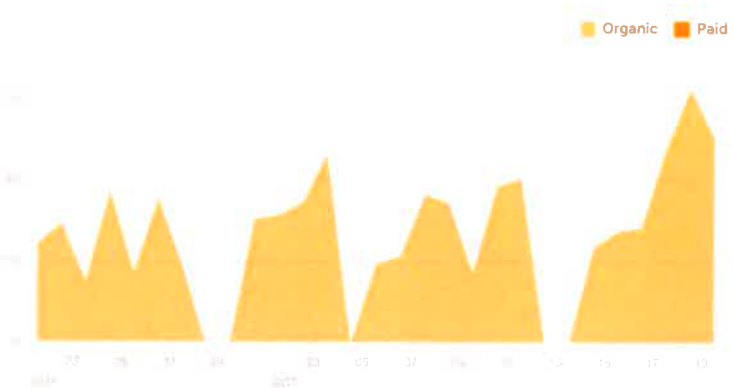

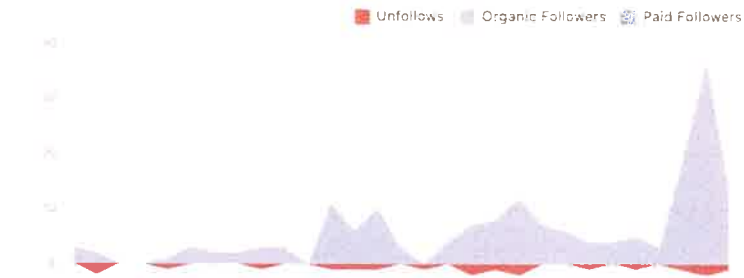
